Together we seek to be:

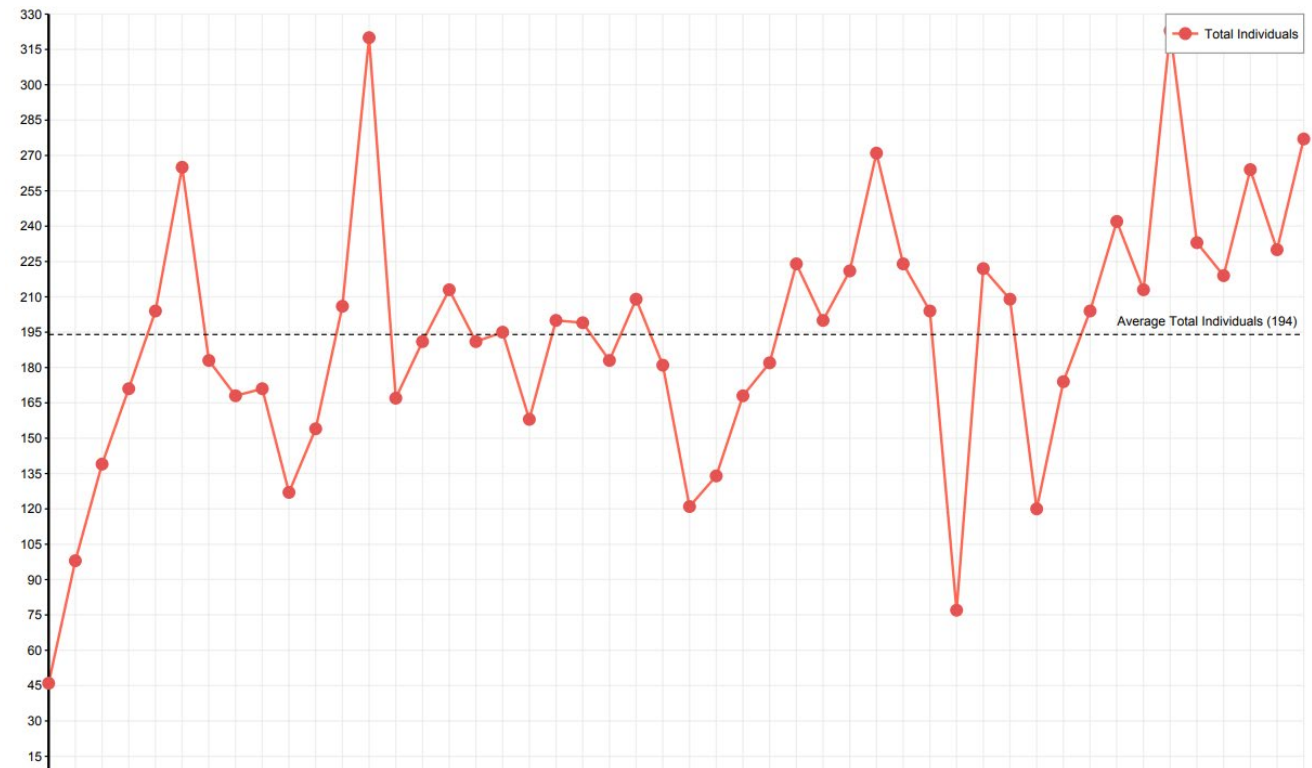
joyfully trusting following and sharing Jesus

The reports from a number of our MHAC ministry areas demonstrate how that vision is expressed in our life together. This is the ministry of the body of Christ in this place. In addition to these reports, I want to briefly reflect on a few noteworthy things throughout 2022 before considering the year ahead.

Sunday services

It seems like a long time ago, but January 2022 was the height of the Omicron wave! Happily as the year progressed, we increasingly saw people return to church, particularly throughout the second half of the year. Across all congregations, our church has seen significant growth. We have nearly doubled our weekly average attendance over the course of the year. All our congregations have welcomed new people and seen them become part of MHAC. God has been reminding us of the joy and encouragement of seeing each other 'face to face' and of how much we need the encouragement that comes from our brothers and sisters (Hebrews 10:23-25).

Church Weekend Away

In September 2022 people from all congregations time out at Waterslea Conference Centre (Nowra) to learn together about how we see Christ in the Old Testament. We were blessed by the ministry of Rev. David Ould and by the opportunity to spend time together in a beautiful part of God's world.

Leadership Development

Throughout 2022 a small team comprising our ministry staff and congregational leaders met regularly to consider how we develop and train our ministry leaders and volunteers. Over the next few years, our goal is to develop a leadership pipeline that equips people to serve effectively in the various ministries of MHAC. Drawing on the work of this group, I have restructured the responsibilities of our ministry staff. Their new areas of responsibility are displayed in the MHAC organisational chart included at the end of this report.

Community

In 2022 we particularly focused on re-building our sense of community, our sense of belonging to one another. We have renamed our small groups as community groups, enjoyed congregational suppers and lunches each month, and we went away together. There is more to be done, however, some good progress was made in building our awareness of our commitment to one-another, as evidenced in the growing health of our Sunday congregations.

Ministry

Throughout 2022, despite some significant challenges as we struggled with the ongoing effects of the pandemic, it was a great joy to see so many people continuing to serve and also involving themselves for the first time in mission and ministry. Here are some of the highlights that we achieved together over the last twelve months:

Engaging

- Through our connect ministries like ESL and Food pantry, we have been able to provide support and assistance to those who are most in need, including the elderly, the unemployed and those with limited English.
- Our Friday Playtime Group continued to attract young mums and their kids (occasionally dads too!) and enabled us to connect with them. It has been fantastic to see that some of these connections have resulted in people joining us for our Sunday services.
- We have also engaged the community by teaching 500-600 kids through SRE (School Scripture). And through our Christmas and Easter services and Carols event.
- We ran a number of Men's and Women's connect events during the year to try and provide pathways for people to become connected with the MHAC community. We also hosted newcomers afternoon tea for those who have visited our services.
- Invitation nights at RAYG (teenage youth group) and bring a friend afternoons at Friday Kids Club.

Evangelism

When it comes to Joyfully sharing Jesus – we want to equip people to be confidently sharing the reason for the hope that they have (1 Peter 3:15). We want to encourage and equip people to read the Bible with others (using the Word one to one). We also want to run Hope Explored regularly through the year following an outreach series so there is a clear ‘next step’ for people.

During 2022:

- We ran Hope Explored during the year to share Jesus with others.
- We also had two 3 week outreach series where the service and sermons were particularly oriented towards the outsider. One of these was a confirmation / baptism service at 6pm that was a great encouragement!

Establishing & Equipping

- The annual Equip women’s conference was held online and watched by women at church – the Men’s Katoomba Basecamp conference was attended in person.
- Our Sunday services are the main way that we seek to establish believers in the faith through the preaching and teaching of the word of God. During 2022 we preached through 1 Samuel, 2 Corinthians, Parables of the Kingdom in Matthew, and a short series on Micah 6:8 Act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God.
- Throughout 2022 we continued our regular pattern of meeting twice each term to support and equip our small group leaders.

Staffing

Our ministry staff contribute significantly to the health of our church family. The resignation of Tom Guthrie in April 2022 was difficult for the Church family and also for Tom and Patty. We had all hoped that this ministry appointment would turn out differently. We owe a debt of gratitude to our children’s and youth leaders and helpers who served throughout 2022. It is important to acknowledge the additional burdens placed on them. They served admirably and applied themselves amidst their disappointment. We are thankful to God for sustaining you and we’re thankful to you, our children’s and youth leaders, who were gracious and persevering in a difficult season.

Someone wise once said the Lord moves in mysterious ways. The departure of Tom opened the possibility for Sarah Barber to join our staff team as Children’s Workers (3 days per week) in January this year. Sarah has been with us for about two months and has been a great blessing. She is gifted in and passionate about ministry to children. As mentioned in the warden’s report, we have confirmed funding for her for two years.

Is it possible for us to grow as a church over the next two years so that we can keep her? My hope and prayer is for it to be so.

The Body of Christ

I mentioned above the importance contribution made by the staff team. Their work is not to do all the work of mission and ministry. But to equip and encourage, to admonish and discipline and teach and correct such that the body of Christ is equipped for the work of mission and ministry.

What we do as a church family happens because Christ is at work amongst us. Christ's body is built as we, members of his body, exercise the gifts and capacities that God has given in loving service of one another. With that in mind, I want to record my thanks to so many leaders, helpers, contributors, givers and prayers who have served in mission and ministry over the last year.

I'm thankful for the ministry of our Parish Council and Church Wardens. Our wardens in particular have served us all so well. It has been encouraging to see members of the Parish Council working well together and taking initiative in stewarding our property and finances.

Looking ahead for 2023

Looking ahead, let me share with you just three exciting things happening this year for our church family to be involved with:

Mission

In 2023 we have slated two periods of focused mission activity during the year.

Mission Focus 1	25 Mar. Men's connect event 1 Apr. Women's connect event 7 Apr. Good Friday 9 Apr. Easter Sunday 30 Apr. Hope Explored
Mission Focus 2	22 Jul. Men's connect event 29 Jul. Women's connect event 6 Aug. Outreach Sun. – Peter Lin 13 Aug. Hope Explored

Between now and Easter Sunday – we're running a variety of connect events so that we can engage our community. We want to build on these connections so that people will come under the sound of the gospel, either in our gospel preaching at church on Sundays or through reading the Bible with someone (Word one to one) or through the Hope Explored Course. We are God's fellow workers – our task is to be a church family that shares Jesus with others. Faith comes through hearing. People hear the gospel, when God's people share it.

Big Day In – mental health

Keith and Sarah Condie are coming to speak with us in September about the Christian Life and mental health. As founders of the Mental Health and Pastoral Care Institute (part of Mary Andrews College), Keith and Sarah are passionate about equipping Christians to better

understand mental and to love and serve others well. This will be a great time together in September.

Community

As noted above, 2022 was an encouraging year regarding our habits of church attendance. We can all attest to how the challenges of the last few years have impacted our habits of Sunday service attendance. God has been teaching us about the great value of regularly gathering together! Yet perhaps we need to have a conversation about what are the challenges, obstacles and thoughts around being regular at church?

One of the best ways we can contribute to our life together is to be diligent in attending each Sunday. It is critical to your individual spiritual life and our life together. We worship together: hearing the word, singing and praying, we encourage each other face to face, to keep running the race. It is where we hear the word taught and explained by those Christ has appointed to bless his people.

Recent years have seen a decline in our habits of regularly gathering on Sundays. How can we encourage each other to be devoted to this? Jesus says that we will be known by the love we have for one another. Part of loving your brothers and sisters is to gather with them, in the Lord's name on Sundays.

Conclusion

We want to be Joyfully trusting, following and sharing Jesus.

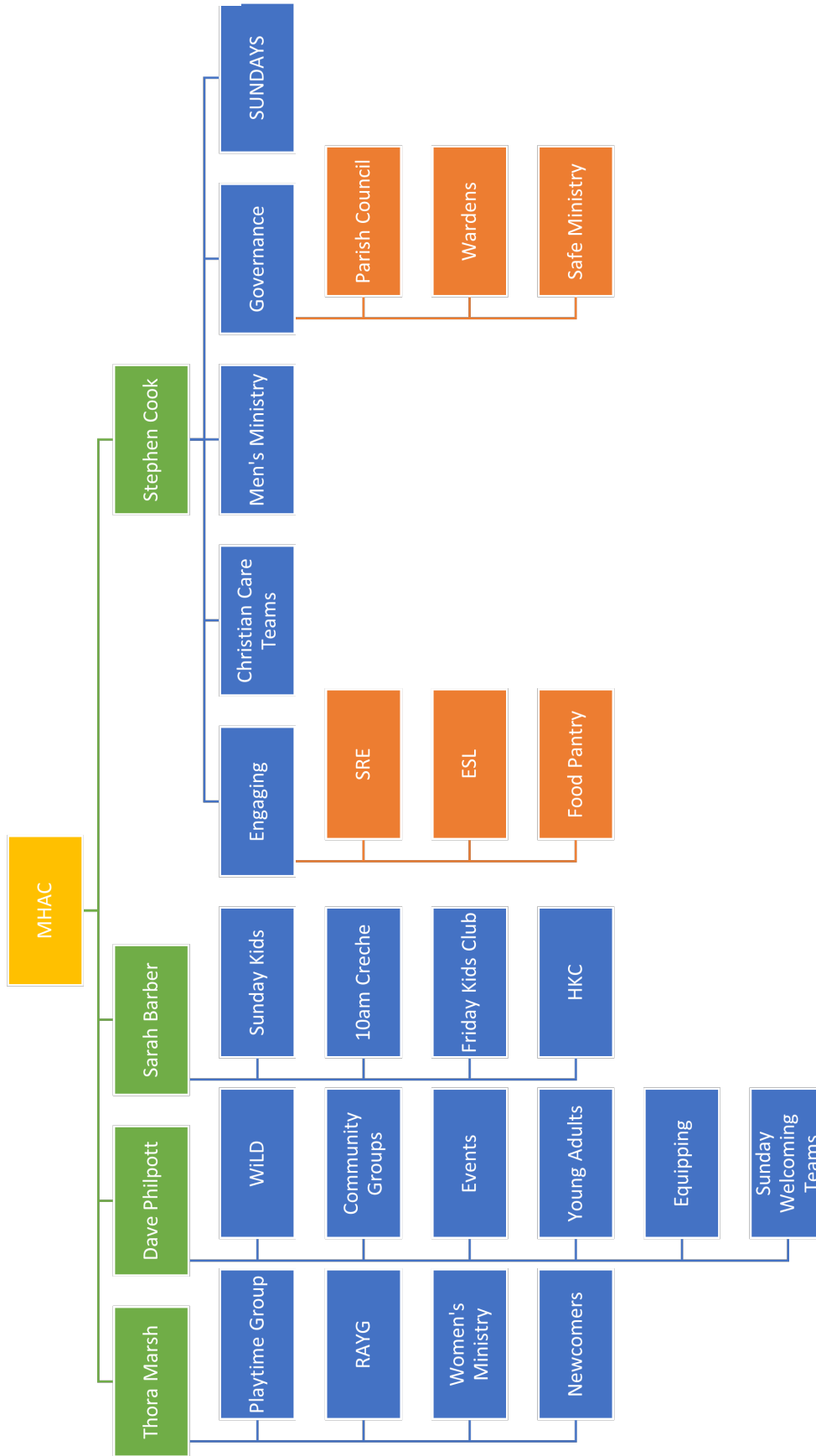
We want people committed to personally living this vision personally as well as pursuing it in our life together.

Wardens report

“MONEY IS OUR SERVANT NOT OUR GOD. LET IT SERVE YOU NOT THE OTHER WAY AROUND.” Debasion Mridha

When we presented our report and Budget around this time last year we sadly presented a deficit Budget. Not something any of us were eager to do. We also expressed our strongly held belief that we would see the church finances recover over the following 3 years provided certain measures were undertaken.

It is indeed a relief and a pleasure to report that this would appear to be well on track

Both planned and unplanned events now see us in a more positive financial position, which is reflected in the Budget. However, we still need a further two (2) years at our current pace to recover monies spent/lost over the “COVID YEARS”. We believe that the current and projected figures are very positive and the losses incurred will be recouped.

You will note we have held the projected offertory the same as last year, being well aware that our overall attendance has not really altered but that mortgage repayments and the cost of basic necessities most certainly have. With this in mind we have held the offertory the same.

The departure of Youth Minister Tom Guthrie and the subsequent renting of 7A Morley Ave to a Parish family saw us both save money as well as receive income. This was not anticipated when the last Budget was created. Thanks to the generosity of Deb and Jeremy Vickers we were able to completely refurbish that residence prior to the family taking over occupancy at no cost to the Parish.

With the long awaited and delayed repairs to St Anne’s Hall commencing, our regular renters were required to move to St Thomas. Most declined to move although one renter has been so pleased with the Old Rectory for their business that they have doubled the number of hours thus making up for any lost income from others.

“Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.” Corinthians (9:7)

With no Youth Minister, other staff and parishioners fulfilled the duties of the position. Unexpectedly, we received another generous donation, enough to pay for a part-time Youth Worker for 2 years; provided we added some of the monies made from the rental income. This is how we now have Sarah Barber on staff. Welcome Sarah.

Another change to staffing was the engagement of Amy Bosker to replace Abbi and Ely who moved on to other work. Abbi to full time training for the Commonwealth Games (Bronze Medal Winner) and Ely to High School teaching at Ashcroft High.

Along with the refurbishment to St Anne's Hall the Wardens oversaw the following at St Anne's:-

- 2 x trees removed, one termite infested
- 7A Morley Ave completely refurbished
- New instantaneous hot water heater installed in church kitchenette
- Pest Control
- Fire safety inspection
- Air conditioning service
- Gutters cleaned

Currently work in progress includes:-

- Vestry refresh, repainting and new carpet and equipment
- Solar panels from a successful grant application to be installed
- Wi-Fi and TV screens for the church and Wi-Fi for the hall.

At St Thomas Church Grounds:-

- Gutters cleaned
- Broken Roof tiles replaced and repaired
- Bell Tower flashing re-laid
- Air conditioning service and upgrade as well as cages for protection
- Trees removal
- Repainting of Rectory
- Car park lines and car stops installed
- Blinds for Ministry Centre
- Graffiti removal
- Major underfloor repairs
- Fence repairs due to vandalism
- Repairs to Ministry Centre due to break-in
- Pest Control

In progress:-

- Upgrade of Church foyer
- Upgrade to Security Camera System
- New lighting for Church interior
- New doors for Ministry Staff offices.

The Wardens would like to take this opportunity to thank Scott Carlsen, Andris Zirins and Dave Smith for faithfully cutting the grass and keeping the edges tidy at both churches and adjacent buildings. We would also like to thank the ladies at both St Thomas and St Anne's who give up their time to clean the churches. The ground care and cleaning saves the Parish

a great deal of money. For David Cox, our heartfelt thanks for all his Spiderman antics on the church and rectory roof checking out damage and effecting repairs.

Unfortunately with a very busy church calendar and rubbish weather we were only able to hold one (1) fund raiser. The Trivia Night proved popular with far more turning up than was expected. The evening raised approximately \$6k for a worthy Parish activity and appeared to be a great success.

Sadly, although a great deal of work went into an application for a grant under the NSW Government Westinvest Scheme we were unsuccessful so at the moment we do not have a plan for a new Ministry Centre.

RAYG exists so high school students come to know Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord, and so they will joyfully trust, follow and share Jesus the rest of their lives. I remember from my time at RAYG that I was encouraged by the leaders to keep following Jesus, whether during a big event like KYCK or a small 3-minute conversation over supper, and I love being able to see that continue with the current youth. The other side effect of RAYG is that it provides a place for the leaders to invest in our youth and be reminded ourselves of the reason we love Jesus.

Over the past year, we had the great opportunity to attend KYCK and to see the faith of our youth bolstered and challenged, and we look forward to going again in April. We also had the “me, myself and the gospel” topic series last year, where we got to explain how the youth how the gospel shapes all of life. That was particularly helpful as it brought the core of the gospel into the big questions that the youth had. As this year has started, we have seen so many new faces coming along, which is a genuine pleasure. Please pray that more youth would come consistently to RAYG.

There have been a few challenges over the past little while. One awesome feature of the gospel is that it is real and raw, and some of our teens have felt that impact. This is a great opportunity as they are coming to terms with the gospel, but it was also a few heavy conversations for leaders. Please pray that God would sustain our leaders with His power and give us His wisdom to care for our youth well. We have also our leader situation change, with a few leaders stepping back from last year. Please pray that God would equip the leadership team with everything it needs to faithfully and joyfully serve these youth.

Friday Kids Club – Stephanie Philpott

Friday Kids Club runs on Friday afternoons (4pm – 5:30pm) for kids in K – 6, as a ministry to share Jesus with kids in our church and local community. In 2022 we averaged 15 - 25 kids each week. Our leadership team in 2022 was: Steph Philpott, Tom Guthrie, Alison Smith, Jodie Barber, Janine Pringle, Bec Zakhia and Luke Hurley.

We had a difficult start to the year with only 4 leaders on team in Term 1. Tom Guthrie left after Term 1, which meant we had to recruit very quickly to keep the group operational from Term 2. Praise God for Janine, Bec and Luke who stepped up to serve each week for the remainder of the year!

Some highlights of the year were new leaders joining the team bringing with them fresh ideas and enthusiasm, and hearing the kids ask great questions about God. Some challenges included declining numbers of kids attending, recruiting new leaders and meeting the challenge of last-minute changes when sickness struck the leadership team.

- Pray for the kids to understand and grow in their knowledge of Jesus, and for the leaders to develop good relationships with the kids.

Mens Ministry – David Smith

In late October, we had our final Mens connect event for the year , with a Dinner at Moorebank. There were about 60 Men, enjoying a Meat feast, listening to Testimonies from fellow brothers in Christ , about the Good and the Hard aspects of following Christ daily. We also had a magician for some fun, and everyone had a great time.

We also had some other activities like bike riding together during the year. Men meeting together to learn and encourage each other is an important part of Church life. Men are faced (as with all) many trials in the Christian walk. It is vital for us, to be part of a community that loves and cares for every member. Endurance is a key indicator of spiritual fitness. Men, we have to keep up the good fight together.....

As coordinator for meals ministry my task is very easy and thankful for the opportunity to bless others with the blessing of others.

The great benefit of a meals roster is the task is shared on MHAC Facebook pages and via email and those who can help at that time jump in and grab a spot and make, bake or buy for our family in need.

A recent roster towards last half of last year for one of our families - saw an abundance of our church joyfully help out the family - even asking for extra spots ... Here is their thankfulness for the love and food shared with their family

I'm not sure how to describe or express our thanks for the meals ministry we received in 2023. We were recipients of a planned and unplanned set of meals! An unexpected hospitalisation of our main meal maker, without request or expectation, a run of meals arrived on our doorstep each evening for a week. Simple, generous provision for our family. A planned hospitalisation and significant recovery time afterwards. Every few days we could see who was bringing a meal, and what it might be. As we juggled hospital visits, and other family responsibilities, it removed the need for thinking, planning, shopping, and preparing meals. The care expressed through the meals ministry, allowed us to care for our loved ones through a challenging time. By using a coordinated approach to meals ministry, not only did it mean we didn't have to field regular questions about diet, timing, quantities etc, but others in our community had opportunity to contribute too. Familiar names, apart from church, popped up on the meal roster as when friends had asked "how can we help?" they had been directed to the meal roster. It was also humbling to receive meals from church cooks, whom we had never even met before.

For our ministry one would say to pray it's not needed but we know that isn't always the case and in joyfully trusting Jesus we pray people will be available should the need arise for meals and sharing Jesus in the meals made or bought and the burden it lessens for those at a trying time.

Anglicare Mobile Pantry – Margaret Brown

The first six months of 2022 the shopper numbers each fortnight ranged from 8 - 16 shoppers. In the second half activity increased to between 15 - 22 shoppers, culminating in 31 at the last pantry of the year. We have a core of 10 people who usually come each fortnight and the remainder less often.

In the second half of the year, due to some donated funds with the stipulation that the funds be used to directly benefit shoppers, we negotiated with the Anglicare Team to provide some fresh food (vegetables, fruit and at times dairy or frozen items) which they purchase at Foodbank on our behalf, then we reimburse them. This has been able to continue as we are charging shoppers \$3 a bag (value up to \$12-20 in supermarkets depending on what is available). Contributions from parishioner's veggie gardens are a welcome supplement to this table. We continue to offer the Hygiene Table (goods provided by Anglicare) and give out the donated bread from Casula Bakers Delight. For our last pantry in 2022 we received a donation of 30 doz. eggs from an Egg Farm to supplement the shopper's purchases.

We gratefully received funds from Anglicare to purchase some tarpaulins and poles to construct better cover for the volunteers and shoppers at the van when it is raining so they don't get drenched, and to purchase some new lighter tables which makes set up / pack up less arduous.

While it is positive to have regular customers that we can build connection with, it is encouraging to hear that some people stop coming because their circumstances improve, such as permanent housing in a different suburb or permanent / increased hours of work. The pantries are busy in attending to the required tasks but we all make an effort to talk with people to make them feel welcome and understand what is happening in their lives, their joys and challenges. And we look for opportunities to talk of Christianity. Invitations are extended to relevant church events, particularly our Easter and Christmas events.

Praise and thanks to God for the kindness and generosity of the people who support Anglicare Mobile Pantries, and in particular our pantry. Also, for enabling us to continue and enhance this outreach ministry.

Pray that the team's energy and willingness to serve will not waiver that we will remain flexible to adapt as needed to continue this ministry, and that as we talk to the shoppers we will recognize opportunities and feel confident to speak of God's saving grace.
